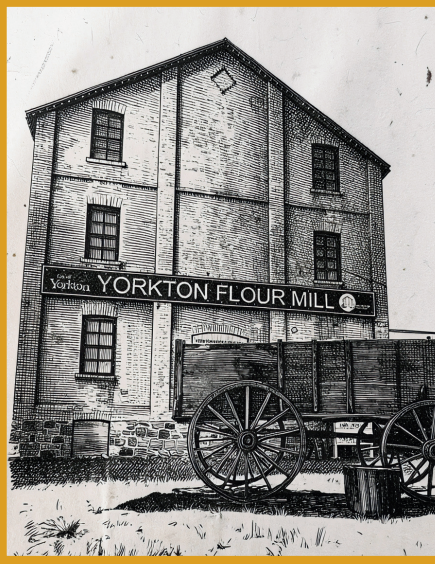

YORKTON BRICK FLOUR MILL HISTORY

The Yorkton Brick Mill Heritage Society was formed in early 2012 by individuals interested in encouraging the preservation of the oldest flour mill in Saskatchewan.

Constructed in 1898 by John J. Smith to support the new settlement's agricultural base. "The Old Mill" was reinvented a number of times by changing ownership and needs until falling into disuse in the mid-1990s. Today, as one of the last remaining symbols of our local heritage, the brick flour mill is being developed by and for those who believe that history need not exist only in photographs and books.

FUTURE PLANS

Yorkton's historic flour mill, Saskatchewan's oldest, has been stabilized and upgraded to allow visitors to tour the inside. The structure has been upgraded, having a new engineered roof, foundation repaired, broken bricks replaced and repointed, reinforced main beams, door, windows and stairs with over \$350,000 invested. Phase II is construction of a new Interpretive Station using the iconic railway roof design. The exterior was completed in 2024 with the interior being completed in 2026. The Interpretive Centre will be used for static and interactive agricultural displays telling the story of grain production and milling in Saskatchewan and should be available Fall of 2026 for event rentals. The new centre will have a mid-sized event space, meeting room, and two offices for community use.
